# **CROSSTOWN QUILTERS HISTORY**

Gathered from 2006 Calendar and memories by Edna MacLeod A group of women from Old South Church in Columbian Square, South Weymouth, MA were involved in the planning of the annual church fair. Irene Craig made a suggestion that she teach some of the members how to quilt and they could donate a hand done piece to the committee. This was approximately 1982. More women than she had planned were interested, and she ended up with quite a group at her home every Friday learning to quilt. The minister gave permission to hold the quilting meeting at the Old South Church. At about the same time, Irene Craig was hired by the Hingham Senior Center Recreation Committee to teach quilting at the Hersey House.

The Hingham group went to a quilt show and talked to some people about traveling workshop sponsored by the New England Quilter's Guild., To take advantage of this, the group had to provide a place where workshops could be held and have 12-15 attend. Since Irene Craig was giving classes at the Old South Church at the time, permission was granted to have the workshop there. In 1983, the group meeting on Friday mornings at the Old South Church decided to become a chapter of the New England Quilting Guild.

The name – **Crosstown Quilters** – was chosen because of the location of the church in reference to the member's home towns.

Irene Craig, with a committee, did all the work of setting up the formal by-laws, and joining the N.E.Q.G. (which has since dissolved). As a chapter of the N.E.Q.G., the Crosstown Quilters had to abide by the rules for regional chapters. The decision was made to have the meetings on the second and fourth Tuesday mornings at 10:00.

Irene was the President from 1983 to 1989. Shirley Pukt was vice president and Barbara Joyce was the treasurer. The first election for officers was held in 1989.

The meetings have been held at the Tuft's Library in Weymouth since September 12. 1989.

**Prizes:** 1st prize:\$50.00, 19 runners up, Quilt pin for the 25th block entered. Also

a viewers' Choice Award will be given.

- **4.** For winners and next year's information after judging, enclose a stamped, selfaddressed long envelope marked "winners" in lower left hand corner.
- 5. For judges' comments, add "comments" on that corner.
- **6.** For return of non-donated block, enclose a self-addressed 6"x9" envelope with adequate postage attached.
- **7.** Blocks donated, unspecified or without return envelop as described above are made into quilts for charities.
- **8.** The junior competition is for youth ages 5-18. All of the above rules and entry dates apply.
